Task 11: Jihad

The media often presents jihad as being a, "holy war," and sometimes an excuse for terrorism or violent acts. In actual fact, jihad does refer to a holy war, but most Muslims understand this to be an internal struggle to do what is right. Write a story about a Muslim who has to decide to do the right thing and the jihad or internal struggle which he or she has.

Task 12: Five Pillars of Christianity
